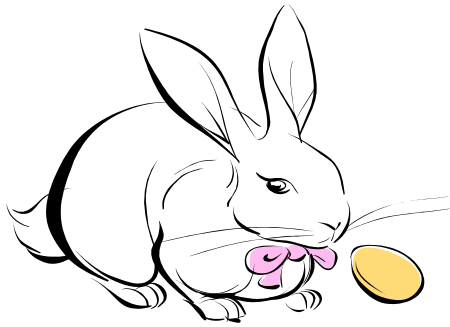
He can tell you how to apply and
