District Applying for Grant/Loan for New Vehicle

The service truck that the District has had for several years was donated to us by Frontier Communications. The truck has been used every day in the district and we are so grateful for it. However, it is no longer in running condition and not worth putting more money into repairing it again.

The District has applied for a grant/loan from USDA to purchase a new vehicle. The District is also eligible for a small sum from the Ford Fleet Program.

It will take some time to put together everything that needs to be done and in the mean time the maintenance operator is using his personal vehicle to continue keeping the District in working order.

The state of California has not ruled yet on drought restrictions. However, they are still requiring a reduction in water use. Therefore, we still cannot have any water on hard surfaces such as driveways and gutters.

The District has wasting water rules always in place. You cannot have water running in the gutter and you

cannot leave water running in the same place for extended periods of time.

As of today's date we do not have specific watering days or times. However, we ask that you do not water in the heat of the day.

If you have leaky faucets, or running toilets you can save water by repairing them.

If we all conserve we may not have to go on full blown restrictions this year.
